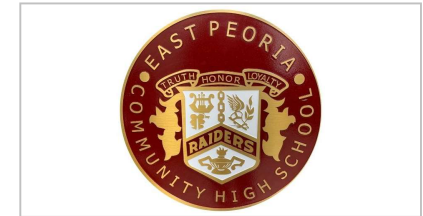

Engage in a public speaking opportunity</li> <li>• Take the PSAT 9</li> </ul> <p><b>Student should know:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• the importance of community service and extracurricular activities to PS and career plans</li> <li>• general cost ranges of various PS options</li> <li>• the relationship between HS coursework, attendance, and grades to PS plans</li> </ul>	<p><b>Student should be supported to:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Complete an orientation course to a particular career cluster or cluster grouping</li> <li>• Select a career pathway within a career cluster of interest through Xello</li> <li>• Compare and contrast personal strengths and weaknesses with career choice through Xello</li> <li>• Attend a PS affordability exploration</li> <li>• Locate scholarship opportunities</li> <li>• Prepare a budget</li> <li>• Understand different banking and investment relationships</li> <li>• Understand the similarities and differences of AP and Early College courses</li> <li>• Review coursework and PS plans in relation to the ISBE College and Career Readiness Indicators</li> <li>• Understand the eligibility requirements to enroll in AP coursework, Early College, and WBL programs</li> <li>• Take the PSAT10</li> </ul> <p><b>Student should know:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• the cost, expected entry level, and midpoint salary for occupations in selected CP through Xello</li> <li>• the benefit of early college credit opportunities to PS access and completion</li> <li>• Different types of PS credentials and institutions as well as educational requirements for their PS plan</li> <li>• the general timing of PS entrance exams and applications</li> </ul>	<p><b>Student should be supported to:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Complete an ELA unit that will include, but not be limited to: career research essay and/or presentation, mock interviews, resume building, personal essays for college, virtual college tours and possible job shadowing opportunities</li> <li>• Locate scholarship opportunities</li> <li>• Attend a college fair</li> <li>• Take at least one college entrance exam</li> <li>• Have the opportunity to take the ASVAB</li> <li>• Build MLA research skills</li> <li>• Take the Accuplacer/qualify for dual-credit coursework</li> <li>• Complete the ACT</li> </ul> <p><b>Student should know:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• career attributes related to career interests</li> <li>• application deadlines, test timing, cost, and preparation options for industry-based certifications and CP</li> <li>• entrance requirements, including application deadlines, for expected PS programs of study</li> <li>• how CP courses and experiences articulate to degree programs at PS options</li> <li>• the negative impact of remediation on PS goals</li> </ul>	<p><b>By 12/31 of 12th grade a student should have:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Attended a FAFSA completion workshop and completed the FAFSA per ISBE graduation guidelines</li> <li>• Met with a school counselor to ensure all steps in the PS admissions process are completed on time</li> </ul> <p><b>By the end of 12th grade a student should be supported to:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If applicable, receive industry-based certification(s) related to the CP</li> <li>• Attend a financial aid award letter workshop</li> <li>• Locate scholarship opportunities</li> <li>• Address any remedial needs in Math/ELA</li> <li>• Complete or enroll in at least one early college credit opportunity</li> <li>• Take the Accuplacer/qualify for dual-credit coursework</li> <li>• Complete the ACT</li> </ul> <p><b>Student should know:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• the affordability of PS options in relation to expected entry-level career salary and anticipated debt</li> <li>• terms and conditions of any scholarship or loan</li> <li>• financial aid deadlines for chosen PS options</li> <li>• 3-5 match schools, one safety school, and one reach school for PS program of study</li> </ul>
