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





Funding in Higher Education

Illinois Appropriations to Public Universities






Illinois Fiscal Year 2024 Highlights




- \$2.53 billion dollars; increase of \$279 million compared to previous fiscal year
- Fiscal year 2024 state budget includes:
 - \$100 million increase to Monetary Award Program (MAP) (total over \$701 million)
 - \$80.5 million (7%) increase for public universities (total over \$1.3 billion)
 - \$19.4 million (7%) increase for community colleges (total over \$415 million)
 - \$3.8 million increase to Minority Teachers of Illinois (MTI) Scholarship (total \$8 million)









Figure 1.0 of the 2022 ISAC Data Book Monetary Award Program Application History FY2008-FY2022






Figure 6.0 of the 2022 ISAC Data Book Characteristics of Paid Dependent/Independent Combined MAP Recipients FY2022

Three quarters of MAP recipients are from Chicago or the collar counties




A majority of MAP recipients attend a public university or a public community college







Illinois High School Class of 2021 Initial College Enrollment Patterns by Race







Illinois Projected Public High School Graduates Through 2035





There are projected declines in Illinois public high school graduates beginning 2026.




Degree Attainment by Race/Ethnicity










Financial Aid Graduation Requirement

Public Act 101-0180



- Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, in addition to all other graduation requirements, a high school senior enrolled in an Illinois public high school must meet one of the following requirements in order to receive a diploma:
 - 1. File a FAFSA; or
 - 2. File an application for state financial aid; or
 - 3. File a waiver/opt-out form with the school district


FAFSA Nonparticipation Form




Created by the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE)

- Must be filed by the parent or if applicable student through the studentportal.isac.org
- Indicates the parent or guardian or, if applicable, the student understands what the FAFSA and the Alternative Application are and has chosen not to file an application
 - Must use the online form
 - Available in English and Spanish







FAFSA Cycle/Application Year (State Rank in Week 39)

Note: NCAN uses projected senior class sizes, based on previous-year school surveys. Application counts do not include Illinois' Alternative Application.


MAP Awards by Fiscal Year








- Incomplete View




