### What does it mean to be first gen?

- "First generation" has many definitions depending on who you ask
- The Center for First Generation Student Success defines first gen as: a student whose parents did not complete a 4-year college or university degree
- Students may question if they are first gen if their older siblings went to college, a family member started a degree but did not finish, or if their parent obtained a degree in another country
- ISAC defines first generation as a student whose parents did not obtain a postsecondary degree
