## District 214 Ready: District and Counseling Postsecondary and Career Expectations

Each student should have an individualized learning plan to help make decisions on careers and post-secondary education or training, plan a course of study, and make financial aid assessments with family members.



## By the end of 9th grade:

#### A student should be supported to:

- Identify Career Cluster and Career Interest through surveys
- Complete an orientation to career clusters
- Select a career pathway within a career cluster or interest
- Meet with a counselor to discuss coursework and postsecondary career plans
- Develop an initial four-year plan that relates to their interests, values, and strengths
- Outline a plan for community service and extracurricular activities related to postsecondary plans
- Participate or determine eligibility for AP Course and Dual Credit opportunities

## By the end of 10th grade:

## A student should be supported to:

- Complete an orientation course to a particular career cluster or career pathway
- Participate or determine eligibility for AP Course and Dual Credit opportunities
- Identify and explore careers related to career interest and/or career pathway
- Compare current GPA, academic, and career indicators with Redefining Ready indicators
- Review and update four-year plan that relates to their interests, values, and strengths
- Explore internship, workplace learning, or community service opportunities related to career pathway
- Create a resume

## By the end of 11th grade:

## A student should be supported to:

- Participate or determine eligibility for AP Course and Dual Credit opportunities
- Complete or enroll in at least one early college credit opportunity
- Identify an internship or workplace experience related to career pathway
- Compare current GPA, academic, and career indicators with Redefining Ready indicators
- Review and update four-year plan that relates to their interests, values, and strengths
- Continue to update and review resume
- Visit at least three post-secondary institutions
- Take at least one college entrance exam
- Develop a post-secondary plan that aligns with career interests and post-secondary education and training

## By the end of 12th grade:

# By December 31 of 12th grade a student should have:

- Completed three or more admission applications to post-secondary institutions
- Met with a school counselor to ensure all steps in the post-secondary admission process are completed on time.
- Compared current GPA, academic, and career indicators with Redefining Ready indicators
- Completed the FAFSA (fafsa.ed.gov)

## By the end of 12th grade a student should be supported to:

- Completed a course, internship, workplace learning, or community service related to career pathway
- If applicable, receive industry-based certification(s) relating to career pathway
- Solidified a post-secondary plan

## A student should know:

- How career pathway courses and experiences articulate to degree programs and post-secondary options
- Affordability of Postsecondary options in relation to expected entry-level career salary and anticipated debt

### A student should know:

- An understanding of graduation requirements and potential opportunities to take a career pathway course
- One or two career clusters for further exploration and development
- Redefining Ready!: The relationship between high school coursework, attendance and grades to post-secondary plans
- Importance of community service and extracurricular activities to post-secondary and career plans

## A student should know:

- Benefit of early college credit opportunities to postsecondary access and completion
- Redefining Ready!: General understanding of college readiness indicators
- The importance of attending a career related activity or career event

### A student should know:

- Application deadlines, test timing, cost and prep for industry-based certification for career pathway
- A comprehensive understanding of multiple post-secondary options and pathways
- 3-5 match schools, one safety and one reach school for post-secondary program of study
- Negative impact of remediation on postsecondary goals
- Career attributes related to career interest
