Determining FY2023 Illinois Monetary Award Program (MAP) Award Amounts

Illinois Monetary Award Program maximum eligibility is calculated based on a student budget, which in FY2023 is 2021-22 tuition and fees plus a \$5,020 living allowance, minus an ISAC-Adjusted EFC (\$1,800 minimum), minus 80 percent of 2021-22 Pell eligibility with a \$6,495 Pell maximum.

For academic year 2022-23, MAP awards are limited to the lessor of the \$7,200 effective maximum award, academic year 2021-22 tuition and fees, maximum eligibility as determined by the MAP eligibility formula. A student must be eligible for at least \$300 to be offered a MAP grant. Awards based on maximum eligibility, rather than the maximum award or tuition and fees, are rounded in \$150 increments. No awards are provided to applicants with a federal EFC of \$9,000 or greater.

For academic year 2022-23, the statutory maximum award of \$8,508 is limited to an effective MAP maximum of \$7,200 by formula and available appropriation.
