District 117: Postsecondary and Career Expectations (revised March 2023)

Each student should have an individualized learning plan to help make decisions on careers and post-secondary education or training, plan a course of study, and make financial aid assessment with family members.

A student should be supported to:

- Identify a career cluster and complete a career interest survey
- Complete an orientation to career clusters
- Select a career pathway within a career cluster or interest
- Meet with a counselor to discuss coursework and postsecondary career plans
- Develop an initial four-year plan that relates to their interests, values, and strengths
- Consider rigorous academic opportunities
- Develop understanding about high school graduation requirements compared to post-secondary requirements

A student should be supported to:

- Revisit career cluster and career interest survey
- Participate in activities related to a career cluster of interest
- Identify and explore careers related to career interest and/or career pathway
- Compare current GPA, academic, and career indicators with ISBE College and Career Readiness Framework
- Review and update four-year plan that relates to their interests, values, and strengths
- Visit at least one workplace aligned with career interests
- Consider rigorous academic opportunities

A student should be supported to:

- Revisit career cluster and career interest survey
- Take at least one college entrance exam
- Visit at least three post-secondary institutions
- Attend a college fair
- Attend a financial aid workshop
- Create a resume and personal statement
- Review and update four-year plan that relates to their interests, values, and strengths
- Consider rigorous academic opportunities

By the end of 12th grade:

By December 31 of 12th grade a student should have:

- Completed appropriate applications to post-secondary institutions as required
- Ensure all steps in the post-secondary admission process are completed on time
- Had the opportunity to attend a financial aid application workshop
- Completed a financial aid application or waiver

By the end of 12th grade a student should be supported to:

- Complete a course, internship, workplace learning or community service related to career pathway
- If applicable, receive industry-based certification(s) relating to career pathway
- Finalize a post-secondary plan

A student should know:

- Graduation requirements and potential opportunities for coursework connected to their career pathway
- One or two career clusters for further exploration
- The relationship of high school coursework, attendance and grades to post-secondary plans
- Importance of community service and extracurricular activities to post-secondary and career plans

A student should know:

- Educational requirements, cost, and expected entry- and mid-level salary of target occupation
- Benefit of rigorous academic opportunities to postsecondary access and completion
- The important of attending a career related activity or career event
- The different types of postsecondary credentials and institutions
- General timing of post-secondary entrance exams and applications

A student should know:

- Application deadlines, test timing, cost and prep for industry-based certification for career pathways
- A comprehensive understanding of multiple post-secondary options and pathways
- 3-5 target schools, one foundation and one reach school for post-secondary program of study
- Possible impacts of remediation on post-secondary goals
- Career attributes related to career interests
- Financial aid deadlines for chosen post-secondary options

A student should know:

- How career pathway courses and experiences articulate to degree programs at post-secondary options
- Affordability of post-secondary options in relation to expected entry-level career salary and anticipated debt
- Where to find local scholarship opportunities
- Estimated cost of each post-secondary option
- Terms and conditions of scholarships, loans, and other financial aid
