LOCATION

Our ISACorps near peer mentors work with middle school through high school students and their parents. We have positions open across the state working in both middle and high schools. Generally speaking, employees working with high school students, are assigned to a region and work with multiple high schools. And, in general, employees working with middle school students are assigned to a single school.

REQUIREMENTS

- Bachelor's degree required. As a program of near peer-mentors, we are looking for candidates who graduated high school during or after 2015.
- We ask that selected candidates commit two years to the ISACorps.
